PROCEDURAL POLICIES

SUBJECT: Adoption or Amendment of By-Laws

POLICY NUMBER: A - 2

APPROVAL DATE: April 12, 1999

AMENDED DATE: <u>May 20, 2020</u>

PREAMBLE: By-Laws may be adopted or amended and reviewed by the Council

of the Municipality of the District of Guysborough as the need and/or demand arises. It shall be the intent of Council to follow specified guidelines as outlined in detail in the Municipal Government Act for the adoption or amendment of future By-Laws. By-Laws are enacted to protect the health, safety and protection of persons, place and property and for such other purposes as

authorized in the Municipal Government Act.

TERMS: The procedure for adoption of a new By-Law is as follows:

1. Once a By-Law is ready to be presented to Council, a Notice of Intent/First Reading will be conducted at a Regular Meeting of Council. This meeting must take place at least 14 days in advance of the Second Reading. A copy of the proposed By-Law shall be given to all Members of Council, this will give Members of Council an opportunity to review the proposed By-law and raise any concerns they may have regarding same.

- 2. The first reading will consist of a full reading of the By-Law by the Municipal Clerk, Warden or such other person as may be designated by Council.
- 3. Following the first reading the Members of Council will be given an opportunity to propose changes in the By-Law and these will be debated, amendments may be made if approved by Council.
- 4. Following First Reading, a Notice of Intent to Adopt the By Law shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Municipality for 14 days and published on the Municipal Website. The notice shall state the object of the by-law, the date

- and time of the meeting at which the council proposes to consider it and the place where the proposed by-law may be inspected.
- 5. The second reading will take place no earlier than fourteen (14) days following the first reading and at the time of the second reading of the By-Law, it will be read in its entirety again
- 6. Once the By-Law or amendment thereto is adopted by a majority vote of Council in accordance with the Municipal Government Act the said By-Law or Amendment shall further be published in accordance with the Municipal Government Act by seeking approval of any Minister of the Crown whose approval is required, publishing a notice in a newspaper circulating in the municipality, stating the object of the by-law and the place where it may be read, and having the Municipal Clerk file a certified copy of the Bylaw with the Minister under the Municipal Government Act.
