Do Not Let Your Child Operate a SxS or Adult Sized ATV.

ATV's must be sized correctly for the driver. ATV's are not designed with children in mind and they are NOT toys.

Stay on Designated Trails.

Riders are required to stay on designated trails. Off-road vehicles are not permitted to travel on roadways or the shoulder of a controlled access highway.



Maritime Launch Update



Happy New Year to all!

As we close on 2023, we are pleased to provide a reflection on what we've accomplished over the past year and look ahead for 2024.

In 2023, we began construction of Spaceport Nova Scotia. We were particularly excited to pour our first launch pad, which was utilized during our first suborbital launch on July 6th. A student team from York University, along with Launch Canada, Transport Canada, NavCanada, and the Canadian Space Agency were onsite to support and celebrate the successful launch in Canso. We were also pleased to see so many community members including the Warden and other leaders within the municipality, MP Mike Kelloway, MLA Greg Morrow and provincial Minister of Advanced Education, Brian Wong. Thanks to everyone who came to our event (or watched the sky!), in an effort to cheer the students on.

In January of 2023, the Government of Canada announced support for Canadian launch and that it was undertaking work to modernize launch regulations to ensure Canada fully participates in the global space economy. Maritime Launch has been key to this work and has been providing expertise to regulators that will "ensure safe, secure and environmentally sustainable" launch from Canada. In 2024, we will continue to support this work and we look forward to partnering with Transport Canada on our upcoming suborbital launches from Spaceport Nova Scotia.

In 2023, we have grown our client base and increased our partnerships within the space industry. The space economy is not slowing down. We are seeing incredible demand from satellite developers across the globe who are looking to launch from Nova Scotia. In the US, it is incredibly difficult, if not impossible, to procure space aboard a mission. Satellite developers are having to wait years to get their technology into orbit. Because of this demand, we announced our DART initiative, a suborbital launch program that will begin in the late spring/early summer of 2024. We look forward to launching a satellite developed by Nova Scotia's own GALAXIA Mission Systems.

As we close on 2023, we'd like to express our sincere thanks to our community for being generous hosts to our visiting students and guests in July. We were incredibly pleased to showcase Canso, Hazel Hill, Little Dover and the municipality as a whole, to visitors from across Canada who came to observe, or participate, in the launch. We received feedback that we've always known to be true – the beauty of the landscape is unmatched, and the people are warm and welcoming.

Port Hawksbury Paper Wind Update

PHPWind held its inaugural Community Liaison Committee (CLC) meeting at the Lincolnville Community Centre on November 30th regarding it's Goose Harbour Lake Wind Farm located in Guysborough County. The 31 turbine sites will be located on crown land that is under long-term license to Port Hawkesbury Paper for sustainable forest management and adjacent to their reservoirs that supply the mill's water. This integrated resource planning will ensure the footprint is minimized, existing woods roads are utilized, and overall efforts are coordinated.

Thanks to those who responded to our recruiting advertisements and volunteered for the CLC. We are excited to engage in information sharing, open discussions, and addressing resident's questions or areas of concern.

During our meeting we provided an overview of the work completed to date, including various studies such as site suitability, species at risk, and many other environmental aspects; many of which are continuing past the Environmental Assessment Approval. An incredible amount of planning was incorporated into site selection, ensuring we avoid sensitive ecosystems and habitats, boreal felt lichen, and old growth areas. As a group, we also discussed various questions covering technical, environmental, and social issues and reviewed the project timeline. Signal Gold Update

Signal Gold Inc. ("Signal Gold" or the "Company"), despite turbulent markets for gold exploration and development companies, has had a busy year advancing and exploring its Goldboro Gold Project in Guysborough County, Nova Scotia. In 2023, the Company made significant strides in permitting the project since receiving its Environmental Assessment approval in 2022, including submission of applications for a Fisheries Act Authorization, Industrial Approval, Minng Lease, and Cown Land Lease.

On the exploration front, the Company continues to explore with its ongoing 12,000 metre drilling program the potential for expansion of the Goldboro Deposit 1.4 kilometres west towards the Dolliver Mountain Mine, as indicated by a geophysical survey conducted in early 2023. Drilling completed so far in 2023 has shown that high grade gold mineralization continues at least 450 metres west of the Goldboro Mineral Resource.

In addition to exploration near the Goldboro Deposit, Signal Gold is actively looking for gold on its largely expanded property position, and is completing airborne geophysical surveys, mapping bedrock geology, and prospecting. Results of the Company's exploration programs will be released as results become available in 2024. With the recently-announced financing efforts, Signal Gold is well positioned to continue permitting, de-risking, exploring and advancing the Goldboro Project into 2024.

Signal Gold is committed to stakeholder and Rightsholder engagement throughout the life of the Project. The Company will diligently continue its community consultation program in 2024.

<u>Updates from ArtWorks East</u>

The new year is a good time to give thanks for the past year and to look forward with hope. The year 2023 marked our 3rd year with a members' gallery on the Guysborough waterfront, which was ably operated by our youth workers Suki Kamogawa and Adalin Watt. Thanks to a grant from the <u>NS Wellness Fund</u>, we were able to offer workshops in jewelry and greeting-card-making by Ruth Fraser Gillie and the first of many workshops on stained glass craftsmanship by Sue Mitchell. A generous grant from <u>New Horizons for Seniors</u> sent Moni Duersch into Milford Haven Home and Canso Seaside Manor a total of 21 times for her creative painting classes. The same grant provided sewing workshops by Alison Billard, the creation of driftwood frames with Sandy Winter, the meditative journal class with Andrea Pottyondy, and more stained glass instruction with Sue Mitchell. A third grant from <u>Recreation Community Development</u> has provided weekly painting classes for the members of GOALS—ably conducted by Lee Leonard—and these will continue until the spring. The activities of ArtWorks East in 2023 were spread out across Queensport, Canso, Whitehead, Charlos Cove, Cooks Cove, Guysborough and Boylston.

One of the other all-stars of 2023 was Adrienne Betts who worked hundreds of hours for ArtWorks East. Adrienne handled all the scheduling for the waterfront gallery and our various workshops. Our membership expanded to 60 people under her leadership; the variety of their work was reflected in the gallery. She pioneered the idea of placing artwork-for-sale in various local Airbnbs (such as the Cove and Sea Cabin). She strengthened our relationships with MODG, the CLC, Mulgrave Road Theatre, Art Makes Kids SmART, and other local non-profits. And together with Marie Rainey of the Guysborough Waterfront Market, they offered the largest Guysborough Christmas Market in many years with 45 different vendors.

ArtWorks East is currently waiting word on a set of grant applications for 2024. But we know the waterfront gallery will open again on Canada Day. And this year, we have plans to paint a 40-foot mural on the Guysborough waterfront, thanks in part to a generous donation from the *Guysborough District Business Partnership*.



Hi there- it's hard to believe Christmas is behind us and we're into 2024!

Since the last newsletter, we wrapped up our Fall Session in the House of Assembly. It's an incredible honour and privilege to represent Guysborough-Tracadie in the legislature as part of a government working hard for Nova Scotians.

We were proud to support emergency service providers with \$1.5 million in funding for much-needed upgrades to important equipment used in response to fires and other emergencies, including

six volunteer fire departments in Guysborough-Tracadie (Aulds Cove, Canso/Hazel Hill, Milford Haven, Erinville, Goshen and Chedabucto). Some of these departments previously received

generators from the provincial government to serve as comfort centres, and all departments in the province have received \$10,000 in each of the first two years of our government.

I was so pleased to see important road work in the constituency near the end of 2023, including a second section of Rte. 16 into Guysborough, the Old Country Harbour Rd. and Rte. 316 from Tor Bay to New Harbour. Of course, there is much more to do, and I'm excited for what's ahead in the 2024 construction season.


