Community Recreation Grants

The Community Recreation Grant Program is designed to encourage community recreation in a manner consistent with the recreation principles, goals and plans of the Municipality of Guysborough. In addition, it is to be used to improve the quality and quantity of community recreation opportunities by financially assisting community groups with new Recreation & Culture Initiatives, Leadership, Youth Programming and Individual training and development.

Community Grants are received and assessed on an "as needed" basis. In addition, it is the policy of council to approve only one community grant per year (April 1st - March 31st) per group or individual.

Community Program Grant (\$500.00) – This grant is for community organizations that are planning programs or events for residents of MODG

Community Hall Grant (\$1,000.00) - All Community Halls and Community Centres in MODG are eligible to apply to assist with the ongoing cost of maintaining a community space.

We are looking forward to our 60th year. Many events are already into the planning stages and it's sure to be a banner year.


The Chedabucto Curling Club Community Activity Society (CAS) in addition to being a welcoming organization is an excellent source of recreation and socialization.



This July, Maritime Launch will welcome Launch Canada to Nova Scotia to host students from York University's Arbalest Rocketry team as they launch an amateur rocket from Spaceport Nova Scotia's first launchpad.

This industry-partnered grassroots rocketry initiative will be led by Launch Canada, an organization that supports and advances the science, engineering and business of rocketry in Canada. Launch Canada represents over 1000 postsecondary students across 26 Canadian universities and their amateur launch competition brings together Canada's rapidly growing student rocketry community with academia, industry and government, to help unlock the full innovative potential of students, showcase Canadian excellence, and expand international collaboration.

Maritime Launch is building Canada's first commercial spaceport and will be looking to hire and build talent, right here in Nova Scotia. We are thrilled to have a chance to support this demonstration at Canada's first orbital launch facility, and perhaps the future home and workplace for the students that are participating in this demonstration.

There are not many places in Canada that can accommodate a high-altitude launch. Usually, Launch Canada hosts their launches in Cochrane Ontario, however, since Maritime Launch has secured a regulated site safe for commercial launches up to a medium class vehicle, it's an ideal opportunity to host the demonstration at Spaceport Nova Scotia.

The vehicle students will launch is called "Goose 3". Last August, "Goose 2" was launched from Cochrane, Ontario along with many other university teams who built and launched their own rocket. Launch Canada follows Canada's regulations that govern amateur rockets as directed under Transport Canada, and they work with many federal and local community partners to ensure a safe demonstration.

We are so pleased to be host to the talent and enthusiasm of some of Canada's brightest and most highly motivated student rocketeers. The skills and qualities that the students will acquire on site at Spaceport Nova Scotia be invaluable for their careers and help drive the growth of Canada's entrepreneurial space and launch sector.

We look forward to welcoming these students to the communities of Canso, Hazel Hill and Little Dover. While this event is an educational tabletop exercise for the students and not open to the public, we look forward to sharing photos and videos following.

Signal Gold Thanks Local Emergency Crews

The months of May and June have been a challenging time in Nova Scotia given the situation with persistent forest fires. Local emergency crews also responded to a fire near the Goldboro Project.

On May 29th, when it became clear at about mid-day that a fire had started in the woods near our core shack, we made the decision to evacuate field staff and contractors and notified Emergency Responders. Responders were on site quickly and successfully managed the fire throughout the day, until extinguished. The Department of Natural Resources and Renewables remained on site the following day to monitor the area in the event of any flare-ups. It was determined that the fire was not related to any foul play. Once determined safe to do so, and in compliance with provincial regulations, staff and contractors returned to the site for work.

We are incredibly fortunate to have local first responders and we want to acknowledge the prompt and thorough response. Also, our thoughts are with those people and communities in the province who have lost their homes, pets, and belongings.


