Message from Hon. Greg Morrow, MLA Guysborough-Tracadie



Guysborough Waterfront Development Society

Since 2001 the Guysborough Waterfront Development Society (GWDS) has operated the Guysborough Marina and Jost Building as a cornerstone for local community activities and tourism development. A volunteer board of directors oversees the running of the GWDS and has successfully maintained a vibrant waterfront that has been enjoyed by locals and tourists alike. Over the years, many young students have found summer employment at the waterfront and many musical concerts, weddings, community meetings and boating adventures have taken place at the waterfront venue.

Today, we are actively trying to prepare for the future development of the facility. We are looking to improve the overall infrastructure to allow for expansion into greater tourism markets, including attracting larger vessels such as the Super Yachts that have visited the marina over the past few summers. But our buildings and wharf area need attention, upgrades are required to improve and maintain our building structures, greater accessibility to the facilities is required to meet the needs of all our population, more inclusive and appealing opportunities to encourage visitors to stay longer on site.

Our board has been able to secure funding to begin the process of making these needed changes. Our overall goal is to restore the two buildings with many new windows and doors, siding on both buildings, improved bathroom facilities, extensive upgrades to the wharf and docks and other amenities that will greatly enhance the curbside appeal and practicality of the site.

Since our beginning, we have had tremendous community support, through times when storms wreaked havoc on the docks and caused extensive damage. Now, before our structures become too far gone, we are looking to make improvements that will allow us to continue to be the focal point of our community. Our project costs, in this first phase of development, is in excess of \$150,000.00. Having secured funding up to 50%, we are seeking financial support from the community to aid in this work, and we are pleased to announce a wonderful contribution from **Jacques and Claire Creppel of \$10,000.00** to kick off our fund-raising campaign!

Should a resident or business leader wish to contribute to our fund-raising campaign, we would graciously accept cheques or e-transfers. As a non-profit society we are able to issue tax receipts for any donation. Our target date for our fund raising is October 31, 2023. Work has already begun and over the course of the coming months we hope to have the majority of the work completed in preparation for the coming boating and building rental season. Thank you for your support as we move forward to maintain and improve the Guysborough Waterfront for all to use!




